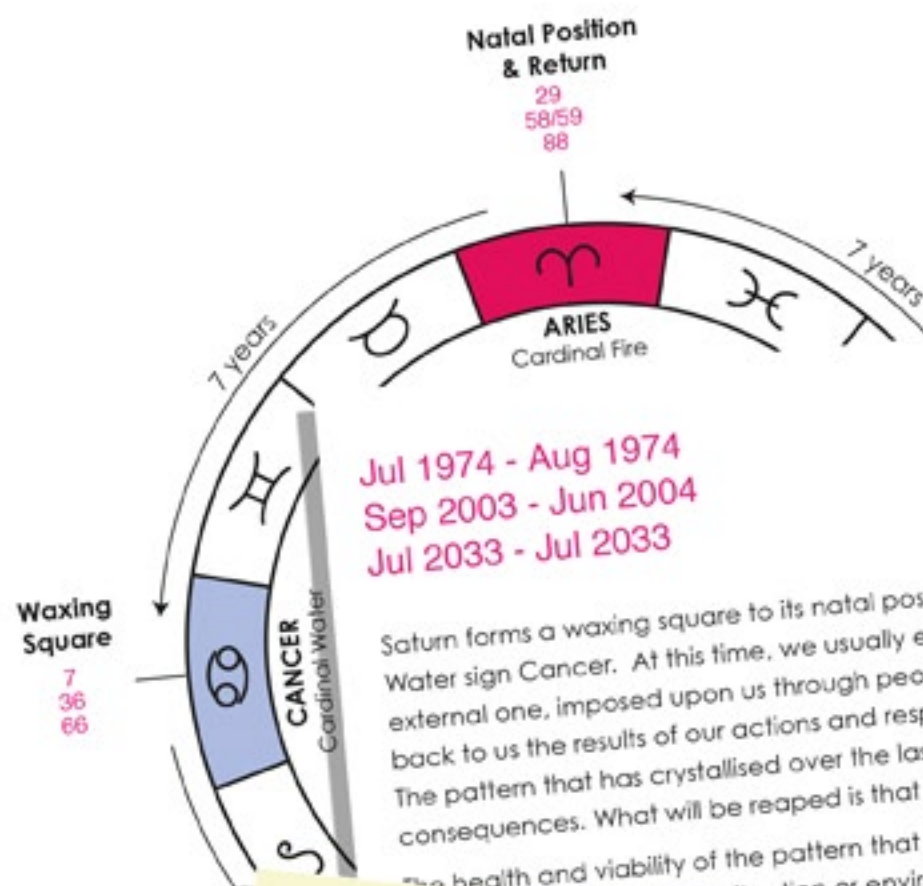

Saturn's Cycle around the Zodiac

The Planet Saturn

Saturn is the second largest planet in our solar system and famous for its thousand beautiful rings. Like Jupiter, Saturn is a massive ball of mostly hydrogen and helium and has some of the most fascinating landscapes in the solar system. It still holds many mysteries yet to be discovered.

Saturn is the furthest planet from Earth observable by the unaided human eye. It was known about for thousands of years. The Ancient Greeks knew about the planet and named it after their god of agriculture - Kronos. But it wasn't until Galileo discovered the rings in 1610 that the rings were discovered. However, he didn't know what the rings were until 1655 when the Dutch astronomer Christian Huygens observed the rings more closely and realised they were in fact rings. Saturn has nine moons with Titan being the largest - also discovered by Christian Huygens.

Saturn rotates in the same direction as the Earth, which is west to east, but it does so much faster than Earth, spinning around once in just 10.7 hours. The fast spin causes Saturn to bulge out in the middle. It's axis is tilted by 26.73 degrees with respect to its orbit around the Sun, which is similar to Earth's.
